## Occupational health provision

You will have received notification that as of 1 April, all primary care providers in GM can access occupational health provision for needlestick and blood borne viruses thanks to a new contract between NHS Greater Manchester and Stockport Foundation Trust in collaboration with Wrightington, Wigan and Leigh Foundation Trust.

The urgent access issues first raised by the PCB have now been resolved and we will update the PCB website with any new updates when we receive them.
