Progressing PCNs – new PCN leadership programme

A new PCN Leadership Programme has been launched by Greater Manchester Primary Care Provider Board (GMPCB) in partnership with the NHS Confederation. <u>'Progressing PCNs'</u> is scheduled to begin on Wednesday 6 September and has been specifically designed for PCN clinical directors together with PCN managers, or another senior clinical leader from the same PCN.

Proactive care – new support offer for PCNs

NHS Greater Manchester Integrated Care (NHSGM) and Greater Manchester Primary Care Provider Board (GMPCB) will deliver an exciting new <u>support package</u> for 20 PCNs in Greater Manchester.

The six-month programme includes targeted support for PCNs to develop new models of proactive care with the aim of improving patient outcomes and reducing demand on primary and secondary care.

'Putting on a brave face?' is a <u>new campaign</u> aimed at health and care staff across Greater Manchester.

The campaign raises awareness of the Greater Manchester Resilience Hub's staff wellbeing service.


