Training guide for social prescribing link workers

A new <u>training roadmap for social prescribing link workers</u> has been released by the National Association for Social Prescribing (NASP). It aims to help social prescribing link workers understand the skills needed for the role, as well as support employers to establish a consistent training offer.

Optometrists helping to save lives

A spotlight is being shone on the NHS Hypertension pilot, delivered by Primary Eyecare Services (PES) in partnership with Local Optical Committees (LOCs) and NHS GM. An <u>article featured on the Association of British Dispensing Opticians (ABDO) website</u> highlights how a blood pressure check during an optician appointment identified that a woman was having an active heart attack and required immediate treatment.

Improve dentistry skills for patients with disabilities

Greater Manchester Training Hub is offering specialised training for dentists as part of its Primary Care Integrated Development Programme.
