Refresh of primary care campaign

The spring phase of the NHS GM '**Get To Know Where To Go**' campaign is <u>now available</u> to download and use on your channels between now and the end of May.

With lots of bank holidays, exam pressures and hayfever season coming up, NHS Greater Manchester is encouraging people to be well prepared and know where to go to get the help they need.

The toolkit includes suggested wording for your newsletters, social media assets and Whatsapp messages covering a range of themes, including promoting NHS 111, repeat prescriptions, pharmacy opening times, and urgent care services for dental, eyecare and mental health.

Measles updates

NHS GM continues to update its <u>measles campaign</u>, and has collated <u>information and</u> <u>guidance</u> for general practice.

A pack of translated MMR assets, including posters, social cards, print-out slips and more in 17 community languages have also been uploaded to the <u>FutureNHS website</u>.

Podcast mini-series

The final two podcasts in the Musculoskeletal mini-series have been published by the Primary Care Knowledge Boost (PCKB).

Episode two focuses on <u>shoulder pain</u>, while episode three is about <u>knee pain</u>. If you missed episode one on <u>back pain</u> you can listen again via our website.

Consider the human aspects with new GP access models

Practices are encouraged to <u>rethink access to general practice</u> in a recent academic study by a Manchester GP.

Training for personalised care workforce

A series of <u>training sessions</u> have been designed to meet the needs of those working in personalised care roles as part of the Additional Roles Reimbursement Scheme (ARRS). Topics include 'monitoring patient outcomes using standardised data capturing tools' and 'exploring additional ARRS roles'.
