GM Primary Care Blueprint Delivery Plan

A delivery plan outlining the year-one actions of the GM Primary Care Blueprint has been published.

Entitled <u>GM Primary Care Blueprint – Delivery Plan: Year 1</u>, the document sets out the agreed actions to be taken during 2024 to 2025, to meet the ambitions outlined in the <u>GM</u> <u>Primary Care Blueprint</u>, as well as contributing to the <u>Integrated Care Partnership strategy</u> (2023).
