# Veteran Friendly GP Practices

Remembrance Day Stakeholder Communications Toolkit 2023







### Introduction to this Communications Toolkit

With news around current conflicts likely to make this Remembrance Day particularly triggering for England's 1.74 million military veterans, GP practices are being encouraged to take the quick and simple step of getting Veteran Friendly Accredited to support veterans who may be 'silently struggling' with their mental or physical health at this time.

While veterans may have distinct health needs, research suggests that many may be reluctant to seek help from healthcare professionals, particularly if they feel they will not be understood – with less than half (48.8%) of those who experience a mental health issue typically seeking formal medical support. Those who delay seeking support report an increase in suicidal thoughts.

As an organisation that is well respected by primary healthcare professionals, your support would be enormously appreciated in helping us to spread the word about the Veteran Friendly Accreditation scheme. This toolkit has been designed to make that process as easy as possible.









## What is Veteran Friendly Accreditation?

The Veteran Friendly Accreditation scheme by the Royal College of GPs and NHS England is a quick-to-implement, free support programme that provides practice teams with a simple process for identifying, understanding, supporting and, where appropriate, referring veterans to specialist healthcare services.

Not only has the scheme been found to improve outcomes for veteran patients, but it also delivers significant benefits to busy practice teams too, saving time and reducing repeat appointments.

It takes just 20 minutes to sign up to the scheme and, in doing so, GP practices get:

- a simple process for identifying veteran patients and recording their status on their patient record to inform future appointments
- an improved understanding of the specific health needs of veterans and the challenges of transitioning back into civilian society
- information on the clear referral pathways for specialist physical and mental healthcare support for veterans, as well as how to provide them with priority treatment access

To date, over 2,300 GP practices have already signed up, with 99% recommending it. Primary Care Networks are encouraged to ensure that at least one practice in their network has signed up.

### Why is it needed?

There are 1.74 million veterans in England - with a veteran defined as anyone who has served a day or more in the Armed Forces - and they may have distinct health needs as a result of their service. Common health issues for veterans include post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), drug and alcohol problems, adjustment disorders, musculoskeletal (MSK) disorders and hearing issues.

However, research shows that many may be silently struggling with physical or mental health problems as they worry that they won't be understood by civilian health and care professionals - with less than half (48.8%) of those who experience a mental health issue typically seeking medical support.

In addition, while the average GP practice sees a veteran patient every day, around half (47%) of practices may be unaware of how many of their patients are veterans - with many healthcare professionals and veterans not fully aware of the specialist veteran healthcare services that exist.



### What are the benefits of accreditation?

Research shows that getting accredited benefits both veterans and practice staff. Veterans get faster access to the right support for a better patient experience and improved outcomes, while practice staff say it makes them feel motivated and proud of their role. There is also the potential to save time through reduced repeat appointments.

In addition, practices receive materials to promote their Veteran Friendly status, sending a strong signal to veteran patients that they are dedicated to supporting them, making it more likely that they will feel comfortable seeking help when they most need it.

Accreditation can also be used to demonstrate evidence of meeting CQC obligations and the legal requirements of the Armed Forces Covenant, which requires that no veteran should face disadvantages in accessing health services and should receive priority care for military attributable conditions, subject to clinical need.
